Keep the Sabbath Day Holy [and other days too]—In too many Lutheran households [and I suspect other denominations] Mom is the 'keeper of the faith'. She rounds everyone up and gets them to church, listens to their prayers and

helps them memorize Catechism verses. But this can't be good enough for us. Our kids are watching.

I recently read an article that indicated if only Mom attends church with the kids, approximately 30% of the children will grow up to continue in the faith. If, however, Dad attends church and makes God a priority in

family life, more than 70% of children grow up to embrace their faith and teach their children to do so. Wow! That means that even though Moms may 'set the tone' of the home, Dads have an incredible influence in their children's lives.

Dads need to nurture their own faith, of course, in order to be able to pass it on to their children. This may be done through regular prayer time and scripture reading as well as being actively involved in the church.

Faith is learned best by example. That means, Dad [and Moms], that you must live your faith every day and in every area of your life. It means being humble enough to let your family see your vulnerability and your total reliance on your heavenly Father. Pray with your children. Ask for forgiveness for your mistakes and in turn forgive and bless your children. You're incredibly important to your family, both today and for eternity. Did you know that, according to a recent poll, Father's Day ranks at the bottom in church attendance? As a Dad myself, that poll surprised me, especially since both Mother's Day and Father's Day began as church events a century ago.

Now Mother's Day does tend to 'pack the pews' of the Christian Church. It seems that on Mother's Day, moms say: "Let's all go to church!" and the entire family goes and listens as the pastor gushes over women in his sermon. But on Father's Day, many Dads say: "I'm going to play golf." Besides that, many Dad's assert that: "While pastors tend to gush over the Moms on Mother's Day, we men get a 'straighten up lecture' on Father's Day!

I am going to change that perception. I would like to thank you Christian Fathers who support and lead your families by giving them a strong spiritual example - and by seeing yourself as a 'family pastor' - leading the 'little flock' of your 'little church'.

Luther's Small Catechism is very specific in its instruction to parents, especially fathers:
"How the head of the family should teach his household to pray."

Then it goes on to tell us to make the sign of the holy cross and say:
"In the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit."
It suggests that we say the Apostles' Creed and the Lord's Prayer. This is to be done both in the morning and in the evening and include any other prayers that you use in your family.

Why is Martin Luther so specific and insistent in this practice? So that "You go joyfully to your work" and "So that you go to sleep at once and in good cheer."
